SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Organizing Authority (OA) is the International Star Class Yacht Racing Association (ISCYRA) in conjunction with the Club Náutico Olivos.

The notation '[NP]' in a rule in the SIs means it shall not be grounds for protest by a boat. This change is added to RRS 60.1(a).

1. Rules

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2. National Prescriptions do not apply.
- 1.3. RRS Appendix P will apply. RRS P2.2 and P2.3 will not apply. RRS P2.1 is changed so that it will apply to the first and subsequent penalties. See also SI 3.3.
- 1.4. STCR 34.3.1 changes RRS 32 to provide that courses will not be shortened.
- 1.5. Per STCR 34.3.1, RRS 33b will apply; leg length may be changed within the parameters of the Format being sailed.
- 1.6. STCR 34.6.3 changes RRS 35, RRS A5, and RRS A10 to provide that boats not finishing within the stated time in the STCR after the first boat sails the course and finishes within the time limit will be scored "TLE" as defined therein.
- 1.7. STCR 35.5 changes RRS 44.1 and RRS P2.1 so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by a One-Turn Penalty.
- 1.8. [NP][DP] While racing, boats shall display bow numbers. The OA will supply the numbers and instructions for their application on Attachment DELTA. Competitors are responsible for maintaining their bow numbers visible on both sides of the bow.

2. Changes in the Sailing Instructions

- 2.1. Any change to the SI will be approved by the Principal Race Officer (PRO), and will be posted by 10:00 am on the day it will take effect, except that any change in the schedule of races will be posted by 20:00 pm on the day before it will take effect. Failure to post notices on the regatta website will not be ground for redress. This changes RRS 62.1.
- 2.1 Any change to the SI will be posted on the Official Notice Board (ONB), located at Club Náutico Olivos near the crane, and on the regatta website https://2021shc.starchampionships.org/

3. Communication with Competitors

- 3.1. Notices to competitors will be posted on the Official Notice Board (ONB).
- 3.2. On the water, the Race Committee intends to monitor and communicate with competitors and Support Persons via VHF radio on channel 68.
- 3.3. Boats may be hailed by Race Officials by either Bow or Sail number.
- 3.4. [DP] Failure of any information to be given or received shall not be grounds for redress. Information gathered on any other VHF channel or RC communication channel shall not be grounds for redress, except when a request for redress under this instruction is initiated by the RC or the PROTEST COMMITTEE. These changes are added to RRS 62.1.

4. Code of Conduct

4.1. [DP] Competitors and Support Persons shall comply with reasonable requests from Race Officials. Note RRS 37.

5. Team Weight

5.1. All teams must demonstrate compliance with STCR 31.1.3 prior to the end of measurement per SI 7.

6. Signals Made Ashore

- 6.1. Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flagpole at the Club Náutico Olivos, located near the crane and in front of the ONB.
- 6.2. When flag AP is displayed ashore, "1 minute" is replaced with "not less than 60 minutes" in Race Signals AP.

7. Schedule

- 7.1. 8 (eight) races, per STCR 27, are scheduled.
- 7.2. The RC may change the schedule. 3 (three) races per day may be sailed, per the Format being sailed per STCR 34.3.7. The Race Committee reserves the right to get one race ahead of schedule should expected sailing conditions warrant.
- 7.3. To alert boats that a race will begin soon, the orange starting line flags will be displayed with one sound at least five minutes before a warning signal is made.
- 7.4. No warning signal will be made after 16:00hs on Sunday, December 12th.

8. Class Flag

The Class Flag will be a white flag with a red star.

9. Racing Area

9.1. The racing area will be in Rio de la Plata, near the Olivos Harbor. See attachment Alpha.

10. Wind speed Limits

The wind speed ranges shall be no less than 5 knots and not exceed 23 knots.

11. Courses [NP]

- 11.1. Course "0", Course "1", Course "3", or Course "4", STCR 34.3, consistent with the Format being sailed, STCR 34.3.7, will be used.
- 11.2. No later than the warning signal, the Race Committee signal vessel will display the course and the approximate compass bearing and distance of the first leg.

12. Marks

- 12.1. Mark 1 (Windward) will be an inflatable yellow mark.
- 12.2. Mark 2 (Gybe, if used) and Mark 3 (Leeward or leeward Gate if used) will be inflatable yellow marks.
- 12.3. For Courses "3", and "4", Mark 2 (offset) will be an inflatable yellow mark.
- 12.4. At the mark beginning a downwind leg for courses "0", and "1", Mark 2 (offset) will be an inflatable yellow mark.
- 12.5. The starting marks will be the RC signal boat at the starboard end, and port pin end boat or inflatable blue mark
- 12.6. The finishing marks will be a RC boat at the starboard end, and an inflatable blue mark at the port end.
- 12.7. Change marks are inflatable orange.

13. The Start

- 13.1. [DP] Prior to the first warning signal of the first race of the day, boats shall sail on Starboard Tack by the stern of the RC starboard-end boat, displaying flag L, to be recorded.
- 13.2. The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the starboard end RC vessel and a staff displaying an orange flag on the port end RC vessel or the Course side of a Starting Mark buoy.
- 13.3. In the event of an individual recall, the bow or sail numbers or other identification of any boat or boats that are identified as OCS may be announced on VHF Channel 68. Failure of a boat to see or hear her recall notification, and the timing and order of such hails, or the length of time it takes to make a notification on the VHF will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 29.1 and 60.1(b)
- 13.4. A boat not starting within ten (10) minutes after the starting signal will be scored "Did Not Start" (DNS), without a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1- A5 and STCR 34.7.

14. Changing the Next Leg of the Course

- 14.1. To change the next leg of the course, the RC will lay a new mark and remove the original mark as soon as practicable. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark.
- 14.2. [NP] In addition to signaling the change from a RC service/mark boat, the RC will attempt to announce the change on VHF Channel 68 as boats approach the RC service/mark boat signaling the change.

15. The Finish

15.1. The finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on the starboard end and the course side of a nearby finishing Mark on the port end.

16. Time Limits

16.1. The time limits will be as specified in STCR 34.3.7 and 34.6.3, for the Format being sailed in the Regatta.

17. Hearing Requests

- 17.1. Protest forms are available at the Race Office (RO), located at the Club entrance.
- 17.2. The protest time limit shall be one (1) hour after the docking time of the RC finish vessel. The protest time limit will be posted on the ONB.

- 17.3. Notices will be posted on the ONB no later than 15 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties. Hearings will be held at the Jury room, located next to the Race Office
- 17.4. Within the protest time limit, the RC shall post the bow numbers or sail numbers of all of the boats that are disqualified or penalized under RRS A5.1.
- 17.5. Decisions of the Jury will be final as provided in RRS 70.5 c). Approval has been granted by Federación Argentina de Yachting and a copy will be posted on the ONB.

18. Scoring:

- 18.1. The scoring system is the Low Point System in RRS Appendix A.
- 18.2. A boat's series score will be the total of her race scores with her worst score discarded when more than four (4) races are completed.
- 18.3. There will be a U-30 division, Master's division, a Grand Master's division, and an Exalted Grand Master's division. Entrants in these divisions also will be competing for the overall Championship. (see also SI 26.)
- 18.4. To request correction of an alleged error in posted race or series results, a boat may complete a scoring inquiry form available at the Race Office.

19. Liability and Safety [NP] [DP]

- 19.1. The safety of a boat and her entire management, including insurance, shall be the sole and inescapable responsibility of the owner and/or entrant.
- 19.2. Competitors leaving the race course before the end of a race shall inform the RC or the Race Office as soon as possible.
- 19.3. Competitors not leaving the dock on a race day shall inform the Race Office.

20. Replacement of Crew or Equipment

- 20.1. Any request for a change of crew shall be submitted to the RC in writing prior to 10:00 on the day of the race for which the change is to be made. If the RC grants permission, it will do so in writing and post such notice on the official notice board.
- 20.2. A change of helmsman will not be permitted.
- 20.3. Substitution of damaged or lost equipment will not be allowed unless authorized by the Technical Committee.
- 20.4. Requests for substitution shall be made to the TC at the first reasonable opportunity.

21. Event Advertising [NP] [DP]

Boats shall display event advertising supplied by the OA. World Sailing Regulation 20.9.2 applies.

22. Official Boats

- 21.1 Official boats will be marked as follows:
 - 22.1.1. Race Committee Signal Boat: White flag with black "CR".
 - 22.1.2. Service/Mark boats: White flag with black "CR"
 - 22.1.3. Jury boats: White flag with black "J"
 - 22.1.4. TC boat: White flag with black "M"

23. Support Boats

- 23.1. [DP]Coach boats, support boats and private spectator boats are expected to monitor VHF channel 68 and to render assistance to a boat in danger when requested by the boat, or at the request of the RC or Jury. See RRS 37.
- 23.2. [NP] [DP]Coach boats, support boats and private spectator boats shall stay 100 meters outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the warning signal until all boats have finished racing, except as provided in SI 22.1.

24. Haul out Restrictions [NP] [DP]

24.1. All boats shall be kept at their assigned locations at Club Náutico Olivos from December 8th 10:00am until the end of the Championship. Boats shall comply with the docking and haul-out plan promulgated by the RC.

25. Diving Equipment and Plastic Pools [NP] [DP]

25.1. Underwater breathing apparatus and plastic pools or their equivalent shall not be used around boats between the preparatory signal of the first race and the end of the Championship.

26. Prizes

- 26.1. Series prizes will be awarded to the skipper and crew finishing first through fifth.
- 26.2. Master's trophies will be awarded to the skipper and crew finishing first in the Series for skippers aged 50 through 59 before the start of the first race. Competitors in the Master's Division will also compete for Series prizes.
- 26.3. Grand Master's trophies will be awarded to the skipper and crew finishing first in the Series for skippers aged 60 to 69 before the start of the first race. Competitors in the Grand Master's Division will also compete for Series prizes.
- 26.4. Exalted Grand Master's trophies will be awarded to the skipper and crew finishing first in the Series for skippers aged 70 or over before the start of the first race. Competitors in the Exalted Grand Master's Division will also compete for Series prizes.
- 26.5. U-30 trophies will be awarded to the skipper and crew finishing first in the Series for skippers aged 29 or under before the start of the first race. Competitors in the Junior's Division will also compete for Series prizes.
- 26.6. Daily prizes will be awarded to the skipper and crew acquiring the lowest score at the sum of the races held on each day.
- 26.7. The OA and the Hosts reserve the right to award additional prizes at their sole discretion.

27. Risk Statement:

27.1. RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

28. Insurance

28.1. Boats sailing in this regatta (each 'person in charge' per RRS 46) must be adequately insured and shall hold a valid insurance certificate showing proof of third party liability for racing risks.


29. Media Rights

29.1. By participating in the event competitors automatically grant to the OA and their sponsors, the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of the athlete during the period of the competition without compensation.
